



## Larry Lev

Larry Lev, age 67, but always 29 when asked, unexpectedly passed away July 31, 2019. A memorial service will be held at Temple Shomer Emunim in Sylvania, Ohio on August 29, 2019, at 2:00 p.m.

Larry was born in Cleveland, Ohio on May 10, 1952. He is survived by Laura Lev, his wife of 36 years. Larry was a Cleveland State grad by education but was a Buckeye at heart. He had a distinguished career with the YMCA, beginning as a lifeguard in 1968 at the Cleveland Heights Y. Over the next 47 years, Larry served the YMCA movement in Jerusalem, Israel, Yakima, WA, Aurora, IL, Dayton, OH, Round Rock, TX, Toledo, OH, Naples, FL, and ultimately retiring as Chief Operating Officer from the YMCA of the Oranges in Central New Jersey in 2015.

Larry was actively involved in charitable organizations in every community he served, most recently on the boards of the Sarasota YMCA and Embracing our Differences. Larry touched the lives of each and every one of the people he met along his way. His family was his pride and joy; he always put them first, and openly bragged about his love for them.

Larry is also survived by his mother, Betty Lev of Cleveland, OH; son, Ariel (Veronica) Lev and daughter, Shoshannah (Chad) Fast, both of Columbus, OH; four granddaughters, Alyssa, Binah and Clara Fast and Evie Lev; brother, Howard (Barbara) Lev, sister, Fern (Dan) Buchler, and brothers Marty (Nancy) Lev and Michael Lev; and numerous nieces, nephews and their children. He was preceded in death by his father, Alex Lev.
