



Albert Wagner

May 24, 1930 - January 19, 2024

Albert Wagner, 93 years old, a resident of Venice, Florida, died at 4:26 pm on January 19, 2024 at Sarasota Memorial Venice Hospital. Mr. Wagner was born in Taunton, Massachusetts on May 24, 1930. He was the son of the late August Wagner and Caroline (Stolarz) Wagner, the brother of the late John Wagner and Della (Wagner) Hathaway and the long-time partner of Albert D'Amico of Venice, Florida.

Mr. Wagner was a teacher in Norton, Massachusetts for thirty-five years and, at his retirement, he was the longest serving teacher in the school system. Mr. Wagner was a veteran of the U.S. Navy who served for four years during the Korean War on the U.S.S. Amphiem. He was a 1957 graduate of Boston University and received his master's degree from Bridgewater State College in 1960.

Mr. Wagner is survived by his partner Albert D'Amico, his nieces Carolyne R. Hathaway of Alexandria, Virginia, Anne R. Hathaway of Berkley, Massachusetts, Susan C. Piccole of Middleton, Massachusetts and Joan (Wagner) Hughes of Pennsylvania and his nephew Joseph A. Hathaway of Fall River, Massachusetts. He was also the uncle of Joyce (Wagner) Jorden (deceased) and John Adam Wagner (deceased) as well as many great and great, great nieces and nephews. He was loved and will be missed by his family and many friends

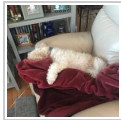
