Alexander "Sandy" Paderewski was born on October 31, 1950, lived his entire life in Sarasota, Florida, and passed away on December 26, 2019 surrounded by family.

Sandy graduated from Asheville School in 1968 and received a Bachelor's Degree from Duke University in 1972. He went on to earn his Juris Doctor from Mercer University in 1975 and spent his career practicing law in Sarasota.
