*Later in life Barbara and I spent winters in Mexico and summers at Leete's Island. I thought a Miata would be a fun summer car to keep in CT and bought a nifty cinnamon red convertible. I thoroughly enjoyed driving on the windy country roads - for about 2 hours til I turned into a pretzel! Andy, Al's cousin, graciously offered me winter storage for the little Miata in the garage connected to his cottage. I winterized it in October and tucked it away for the season in Andy's garage and Barbara and I flew off to California to visit our kids before going to our winter home in Mexico. While in California, it was discovered that I had serious cancer which needed immediate treatment. Between Chemo, a long operation followed by additional rounds of Chemo, it meant we would be staying in California through the Spring and Summer, instead of going to Mexico and returning to CT for the Summer. I needed to get the car out of Andy's garage in the Spring. I called Allen from my hospital bed in California and asked if he would help me sell the car - to which he eagerly responded "Yes". I advertised it in the CT Auto Trader and talked to perspective buyers. If they wanted to see or test drive the car, I asked them contact Allen. He was confronted with a dirty car with electrical issues which took some time before he could even get the car out of Andy's garage and into showable condition and on the road. Then he put his life on hold, to accommodate potential buyers' schedules to see it and test drive it. He used his early sales experience from Monaco Ford to find the perfect buyer and even got more than the asking price. He handled the paperwork for me as well. What a smooth operator! I have been eternally grateful to him ever since.*

*Living on opposite coasts meant we didn't see each other very much in our later years. But we would always celebrate with lobster when Barbara and I came back East. Something to look forward to. Allen and I kept in good contact by phone, frequently bemoaning the trials and tribulations of aging. But also keeping good track of each other's kids, grandkids, mutual friends and major life events. Those conversations were important to both of us and will be greatly*

“ Allen and I met in 3rd or 4th grade when our families started to spend summers at Leete’s Island in Guilford, Ct. We spent lots of time amusing ourselves around the rocks, beaches and marshes and bays. We learned to swim, clam, row and operate motor boats. The Leete family had dairy cattle in those days and we enjoyed exploring the woodlands and pastures including climbing the upper crossbeams and jumping into the hay in the old barn at the end of Corncrib Hill. In early August we harvested the wild Wineberries. We played lots of Wiffle Ball, walked up the hill to “Art’s” (Sanborn’s) store on Rte 146 for snacks and continued up Moose Hill Rd to the railroad bridge to hang out or put pennies on the tracks. The engineers blew their whistles and waved in those days. Rainy days we spent playing cards or board games or walking around in the rain. We threw a lot of stones. We had a good group of kids and Allen was always in the midst.

As we got older, our bikes became our magic carpets. We would ride to the town park in Stony Creek and play basketball or hang around the docks. We explored the caves and woods up on Moose Hill Road. We also ventured into Indian Cove and Mulberry Point and found there were nice kids there as well. Some days we pedaled into the Guilford green and maybe out to Maple Shade Dairy for an ice cream cone. (Allen worked a few summers, as a morning delivery boy, on the Maple Shade Dairy truck as it came along the shoreline delivering milk to the homes and cottages). My best summer ever was the last one before we were all able to drive...

Life gets complicated and people move on. After several years sea in the Merchant Marine, I found myself working and living in Fairfield county. Allen was a pharmaceutical rep and had a statewide territory he would cover. We had some robust lunches and evening cocktails on his swings through our area. They were a lots of fun! All through life’s ups and down we stayed in touch and shared the good and bad with each other.

*Allen was an avid fan of the “Fabulous Farquahr”. Three talented brothers and a kid a bit older than us from Leete’s Island, formed an upbeat pop/ folk band which featured a lot of original songs including some very clever and hilarious numbers. They were extremely popular at bars and theaters throughout New England. Always a good time to meet up with Allen when the Farquhar were performing in town!*

*Allen loved to cheer on the Boston pro sports teams and a great fan Tom Brady. His fervor for UConn Basketball, particularly the UConn Women’s basketball team, was outstanding over the years. After becoming a Florida resident he became enamored with Florida pro sports also. He was a happy guy and very gregarious by nature. I always appreciated Allen’s out going and friendly nature. He was well known and liked by so many people! Everybody knew Allen! Over the years, he had some great dogs which became his constant companions. They got smaller as he got older, but they were indeed fortunate animals to experience his care and affection. Throughout his life he became a great handyman tackling all sorts of projects. His compulsive tag-sale expeditions provided him an up-to-date tool chest and many other useful “treasures”.*
