Born in the fragrant springtime on April 6th, 1929, in Letcher County, Kentucky, Tom & Mandy Boggs welcomed another new life, the last of their nine offspring. A difficult home birth, two of her elder siblings were charged with the task of choosing her name, hence came, “America”.

The sweet rolling hills and lush mountains filled with farm life, family, and a footbridge to her homestead, were where her early days began. Milking cows and playing through the seasons, birthed an imaginative young girl who brought light, life and laughter to her kinfolk and townspeople alike. Her pitch-black hair, olive skin, and lively spirit made her not only the favored baby of the clan, but a treasured addition to the Boggs family in their deep hollow of the South in Linefork, KY. She is survived by one sibling, her dear sister, Ella, age 95. Their sisterhood was filled with daydreams, and deep-rooted love and adventure, as they remained treasured friends until the very end. America instilled all the beautiful traits of a true, graceful, southern woman into both of her treasured children, with proficiency in cooking, housekeeping, and properly caring for a home at the forefront, leading by her Proverbs 31 example. Both of her daughters were by her side in her last days, remaining steadfast to their mother's wellbeing and care.

She continuously made a warm and welcoming space for her family and friends to gather, with no expense or effort spared adorning her table with homecooked goodness, never failing to add sweet confections and a dash of laughter.
