



# Armande Celestine "Aimee" Browning

August 2, 1924 - December 18, 2018

Armande Celestine "Aimee" Browning (née Amblard) died after a long illness in Sarasota, Florida on December 18, 2018 at the age of 94.

Armande was born on August 2, 1924 in Paris, France, on Rue Saint-Martin, near the Paris city hall, to Marie Anne Trividic and Marcel Eugene Amblard. She was a member of the Chi Omega sorority at West Virginia University and graduated in 1947 with a degree in French. On July 4, 1947 she married Jackson Browning, who was in law school at the time. Over the next 14 years the couple welcomed four children into their home. The couple moved first to Queens, then Ardsley before settling in Scarsdale, New York where the children graduated from high school.

In the early 1960's Armande earned her real estate agent's license and went to work selling houses. She proved to be a wizard at matching buyers to houses. She obtained her Broker's license and in 1975 she and 3 partners purchased the Julia B. Fee Real Estate Agency. From then until her retirement in her 80's she was constantly involved making deals selling houses throughout southern Westchester County, New York.

Armande loved golf. She started playing at Scarsdale Golf Club where she once captured the Women's Niners Championship. She also greatly enjoyed playing at Winged Foot Golf Club and Sea Island (GA) Golf Club with family and friends. Armande was always actively involved with the community and was a member of The Scarsdale Woman's Club.

Armande is survived by her son Jackson Browning, Jr. of New York, NY; son James (Robin) Browning of Westfield, NJ; daughter Elizabeth (Gregg) Jones of Palmetto, FL; daughter-in-law Lisa Browning of Barrington, RI; grandchildren Christopher, Karen (Christopher Ahern), Jackson (Alyssa), Lauren, Alyssa, Russell, and Kristin and great

granddaughter Claire Ahern. She was preceded in death by her husband of 65 years, Jackson Browning and her son Dr. Richard Browning; daughters-in-law Susan Pollard Browning and Becky Shaver Browning.
