Bert worked his way up in the insurance industry first as an employee, partner, owner, and then started other businesses. Along the way, Bert and Beth put three children through college. Bert's life went from the depths of despair to seeing the best the world had to offer.

Bert and Beth loved traveling the world and instilled their love of travel to their kids and grandkids. Bert always had a positive outlook on life and helped many people during his lifetime. Bert was a member of the Masonic Lodge and Signal Hill United Methodist Church.
