



Dr. Kenneth James Campbell

Dr. Kenneth James Campbell, Aug. 17, 1930 - May 17, 2016, although born in Massillon, Ohio, spent 55 years in Washington, D.C. He enjoyed retirement in Florida; the aegis of his life in the capitol was forever foremost in his mind.

After graduation from Kenyon College in 1952, he attended the United Theological Seminary earning a M. Div. degree in Hebrew and Theology. Subsequently, he attended Johns Hopkins University taking Biblical Hebrew and Cognate languages. He continued study at the University of Maryland, earning a Ph.D. in Administration of Higher Education.

Retiring after 26 years, as Prof of Economics at Gallaudet University, Washington D.C. He then served as Executive Director of the National Historical Intelligence Museum. Kenneth also spent 9 years as Professor of Intelligence at American Military University.

Kenneth was a prolific writer, having more than 60 articles published in the American Intelligence Journal. These dealt primarily in the rise in power of Adolf Hitler in the 1930's examining the psychology of those involved in espionage. He wrote one book entitled, *Moscow's Words, Western Voices*.

Immediately before his death, he completed the editing of an article on the life of Pope Pius XII and his secret work in spying during WW II. Much of his

research was in German Volumes and he could engage in conversation with native speakers.

Dr. Campbell had resided at the DeSoto Beach Club with his wife, Marilyn Irwin Riordan (nee Murner).

His immediate survivors include, two cousins; Janet Faith Campbell of Broomfield, CO and Arthur Campbell of Akron OH. He will be sorely missed by his friends Dr. and Mrs. William Kraut and John Lipkin, both of Venice FL.

Kenneth was a devout Catholic and a member of St. Martha's Catholic Church in Sarasota FL. A funeral mass is scheduled at the church on Orange and Fruitville Roads on Tuesday, May 31st at 10:00 AM.
