Elizabeth Smith Bagby, 96, died March 25th, 2018. She was often described as the energizer bunny because of her unlimited and boundless energy. Her calendar was always full with gardening, social and musical events. Betsy was born in Lincoln MA, attended Concord Academy and Finch College. She met her husband John (Jack) Bagby at a Princeton football game and they married in 1942. She and Jack began their life together in New York City, moving to Birmingham MI in 1946. Betsy was a member of the Birmingham Village Woman's Club, Michigan Opera, President of the Birmingham Junior League and a founding member of the Birmingham Unitarian Church. In 1977, Betsy and Jack bought a condo on Siesta Key and she began her involvement with the Sarasota community, becoming a member of the Sarasota Garden Club, a sustainer in the Junior League of Sarasota, a supporter of the Key Chorale and a founding member of the Sarasota Opera Association .
