Franky was a force of nature in Sarasota, arriving in the 1960s, she was a founder of Booker Bay Haven School. She was on the Boards of over a dozen local organizations.

Franky was a Consumer Fraud Analyst for the 12th Judicial Circuit, serving under State Attorney Jim Gardner for seven years. For over 26 years, Franky was publisher of "Concerned Consumer Advocate Newsletter". A monthly "No Holds Barred" format of humor, vital consumer news, and Franky's own personal comments.
