March 17, 1954 - September 14, 2021

Gary S. Lane, 67, passed away on September 14, 2021 in Sarasota, Florida after a brief illness. Gary was born on March 17, 1954 in Lewiston, Maine and graduated from Montville High School in Oakdale, Connecticut 1972.

Gary was the son of Theodore R. Lane and Ruth (Belmont) Lane. He was pre-deceased by his father, Theodore and mother, Ruth.

As a Coast Guard kid, Gary spent time growing up in Auburn, Maine, Cape May, New Jersey, Hollywood, Florida, and Oakdale, Connecticut with his parents and sister Sandra (Sandi). After high school graduation he spent time in Hawaii and then attended the American College in Lucerne, Switzerland. After returning to Auburn, Maine, he attended what was Central Maine Vocational Technical Institute, the present Central Maine Community College, where he studied graphic design.

When Gary moved to Florida, he settled first in Stuart, working for a marketing agency and then independently in and around Stuart and then Sarasota after he moved there. Later, he became a Certified Nursing Assistant, receiving certificates in Alzheimer's and Parkinson's care. He partnered with health care agencies and also worked long-term private duty assignments with many patients on behalf of families who came to depend on his diligence and care for loved ones in difficult circumstances.

Ever the dreamer, talented artist and creative spirit, Gary was as much of the spiritual world as the real world. He loved being with family and friends and enjoyed music, biking, the ocean, volunteering for various nonprofit causes through his affiliation with Sarasota's Parrot Head Club and, of course, cooking up the most flavorful ribs one could imagine time and again at family and friends' get-togethers. He was a devoted son and caregiver to both his parents, especially in their later years when they needed his skills. Gary will be remembered for his easy smile, humor, storytelling, and love of family and friends.

Gary is survived by a sister, Sandra Lane Peterson and her husband Stephen E. Peterson

of Richmond, Virginia, a nephew, Bradford Lane Peterson and a niece, Leah Kathryn Peterson Munn and her husband Jonathan, all of whom are from Richmond, Virginia and life partner, Ann Andrews of Sarasota, Florida. Gary also leaves behind cousins Patricia Sloat and husband Bryan, Cindi LaHaye and partner Mike Yates, Michelle Manter and husband Kevin, all of Freeport, Maine, Richard Lane Bixby and wife Susan, of Sanbornville, New Hampshire.
