Gerald "Jerry" James McCarthy, 84, passed away peacefully on September 24 2017 in Venice, Florida.

He was born in Waseca, Minnesota, and after graduating from Waseca High School went on to get a first degree in Mathematics and Philosophy from St Mary's University in Winona. Religion was important to him and as part of his studies he spent two years within St Mary's Seminary. He later completed a Masters degree in Mathematics at University of Montana.

He spent most of his career as a highly respected high school Math teacher at US Air Force bases in France, Germany and England. In his later years he also taught Computer Science and was instrumental in establishing the curriculum in this area for all the US Air Force high schools in England. Outside work he enjoyed experiencing the culture and cuisine of Europe and sharing stories and ideas with fellow teachers.

He settled down in England after a few years and became more focused on supporting his growing family and encouraging and providing for their education and development. In retirement he began to miss his home country and so chose to split his time between homes in Venice, Florida during the winter, and Newbury, England in the summer.

He is survived by his wife, Doreen, daughter Helen McCarthy-Tennant (Paul), Andrew McCarthy (Emma) and James McCarthy (Mary) and five grandchildren: Ben, Ella, Tom, Matthew and Daniel. Jerry is also survived by his brother George Brendan McCarthy (Jean) of Albert Lea. He is preceded in death by his father, George "Judd" James McCarthy, mother Esther Morene (Gear) McCarthy, brother John Patrick McCarthy and sister Mary Ellen (McCarthy) Dickirson.
