Gloria Moss, two weeks shy of her 100th birthday, passed away peacefully at home on Monday, April 29th surrounded by those who loved and cared for her. She is survived by her daughters Marian Moss of Sarasota, FL, Judy Moss of Lenox MA, and Peggy Moss of New York City; her grandson, Jeffrey Album of Seattle, WA and his 2 daughters, Sofia and Aliza.

Gloria and her late husband, Marty, moved to Sarasota in 1956 with their three daughters and under the family business of Moss Brothers and Sons developed and built many areas of Sarasota. They both were very philanthropic in the Sarasota community and served on many Boards to this day.

Gloria was born in the Bronx, New York, raised in Queens, graduated from New York University in 1945 with a Bachelor of Science Degree. She worked with her husband in building their business in Sarasota. In 1968 the Teacher and Administration Strike in Sarasota County began and she stepped in to keep the schools open and thus became a substitute teacher continuing for the next 20 plus years.

The funeral service will take place at Toale Brothers Funeral Home, 40 N. Orange Avenue on Wednesday, May 1, 2024 at 2PM with Burial to follow at Temple Beth Shalom Cemetery.
