Ian Michael Bacon of Lakewood Ranch, died at Tidewell Hospice House in Bradenton on April 17th. Ian was the epitome of an English Gentleman. He was gracious, soft spoken, intelligent, generous, kind and very well-liked by all.

Born 3/9/1940 in Canterbury England where he graduated from the Old King School-“OKS”. Ian worked in property development in England, Spain, Barbados and eventually in the United State. In 1978 he moved his family to work at Forest City in Cleveland, Ohio. After his retirement in 2003 he and Galen moved to the Sarasota area.

Ian, an avid golfer, was a member of the LWR golf club. He loved his weekly volunteering at the Southeastern Guide Dogs where the puppies had to learn commands via his British accent.

Ian was devoted to his family. He is survived by his wife of 50 years, Galen, his daughter Sarah Jane Lyons, son Jonathan Gil Bacon and granddaughter Sage Hannah Lyons.

During his illness and his death, Ian displayed the same dignity by which he led his life.
