Jerry L. Smith, known to friends and family as “Hunt,” died peacefully surrounded by his wife and children on March 1, 2021.

He was known for his acerbic wit and masterful storytelling recounting his experiences growing up in the bootheel of Missouri, serving as CFO of chemical companies and pharmaceutical research firms, and globetrotting with his wife, Donna.
