



Joe R. Brannon, Jr.

November 9, 1944 - March 13, 2017

Joe Royce Brannon, Jr. went home to be with the Lord at age 72 on Mar. 13th, 2017, in Lakewood Ranch.

He is survived by his wife of 46 years, Mary C. Brannon; son Jeremy and wife Allie of Acworth, Georgia and their five children Iain, Cory, Laina, Mason and Ivy; son Phil and wife Kelly of Lakewood Ranch, FL and their son Miles; brothers Larry Brannon of Flowery Branch, Georgia, Don Brannon of The Villages, Florida, and sister-in-law Gloria Bellis, also of The Villages.

He was preceded in death by his parents Joe Sr. and Olga Brannon and his brother Rick Brannon.

Joe was born in Washington, DC. and his family moved around while his father was in the Navy. He and his brothers enjoyed growing up by the ocean, exploring tidal pools at the beach in Satellite Beach, FL. His interest in marine life later led him to pursue a Master's in Zoology at the University of Florida.

As he began his career as a high school science teacher, he met his wife Mary, when they taught together in Port St. Joe, FL. It was love at first sight for him! After a brief courtship, they were married on Valentine's Day, 1971.

Joe later sensed a call to ministry and earned a degree in music ministry at

the Southern Baptist Seminary in Louisville, KY. Pastoral ministry became the focus of his life's work and he pastored a rural SBC church in Rayle, Georgia. The family moved to Sarasota when he accepted the call to pastor Colonial Oaks Baptist Church in 1984.

Prior to retirement, Joe taught middle school science at Braden River Middle. He was involved as Lakewood Ranch Baptist, teaching Sunday school classes, leading prayer, and preaching occasionally. He was also served with Child Evangelism Fellowship and Jordan Prison Ministry. Joe prioritized leaving a godly legacy for his grandchildren.

Joe's passion was sharing the joy of knowing Jesus Christ.

A celebration of his life will take place at Lakewood Ranch Baptist Church at 1pm Saturday March 18, 2017.
