John Charles Greer Sr., born in South Bend, Indiana, to Arnold and Esther Greer, passed away on March 6, 2023, at the age of 82, after a twelve-year valiant battle with Parkinson's disease. He will be remembered as a loving partner, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, great-great-grandfather, and friend.

John is survived by his partner of 32 years, Fely Melicado, and their son, Jonathan Greer. He also leaves behind his son, John Greer Jr., and daughters, Debbie and Melanie, from a previous marriage. John was a proud grandfather to 11 grandchildren, 13 great-grandchildren, and 3 great-great-grandchildren. John is also survived by his only sibling, Joni Greer, nephew Richard and wife Melinda and two children, all live in California.

John's passion in life was playing squash, tennis, and sailing. He was also known for his love of vintage cars and was a well-respected Corvette collector. He and his family have traveled around the USA in their RV to see the many state and national parks. John was a successful entrepreneur who studied Financial Economics and graduated at the University of Florida in 1963. He purchased his first car for trading in 1957, became a car dealer in 1963. To date, his car dealership in Bradenton is still open and running. John Greer Auto Sales is one of the oldest Car Dealerships in the Bradenton area. In 1966, his good friend, Butch Glasgow (Founder and CEO of USA Fence) gave

him a book that inspired him to buy his first rental (a 4-plex), the year his first son was born and since then had added many more properties both in Bradenton and Sarasota locations. John was presented a Certificate of Recognition by Wealth Builders of Sarasota Members for the Year 1998 for his Tireless Efforts and Dedicated Service to the Club as the Executive Director. John was also the founder of Young Entrepreneurs of Sarasota (YES) Group in 2005 along with three other friends. He was a very positive and determined man, a great teacher, a mentor, undeniably a grand master, full of knowledge and enthusiasm. He helped many people in his journey in life.

When John was first diagnosed with Parkinson's disease, John and Fely were tireless about battling the disease and were proactive in finding ways to make him comfortable. He became an active member of Parkinson's Place in Sarasota. He regularly attended classes and activities at Parkinson's Place. When they reopened during the pandemic, John was eager to return to his routine at Parkinson's Place. He was so happy when he saw his friends over there. We were very grateful for Parkinson's Place.

John will be remembered for his friendly nature, kind spirit, great sense of humor, and his love for his family. He was a dedicated partner to Fely, a loving father to his children, and a doting grandfather to his grandchildren.

John's legacy will live on through his family and friends. He will be missed dearly by all who knew him. Rest in peace John.
