Judith Ann Flynn, 82, passed away on January 28th at Sarasota Memorial Hospital. Judy resided at the Highlands Assisted Living at Palmer Ranch in Sarasota. She is survived by her 4 children, Michael Flynn of Branford, Ct, Susan Flynn, of Burlington, VT, JoAnne Hanrahan of N. Kingstown, RI and Brian Flynn of Attleboro, MA. –she is also survived by 10 wonderful grandchildren.

Born in Chicago, IL to Walter and Evelyn Peterson—Judy moved to Mt. Prospect, Il where she spent her childhood and went on to attend the U. Of Illinois where she was an active member of Delta Gamma Sorority. She graduated with a BA in Elementary Education. She spent two summers working in Boothbay Harbor, ME where she met her late husband, Brian Flynn.

Judy and Brian moved several times around the Northeast with their children before settling in Glastonbury, CT where they spent their formative years. Judy devoted most of her time raising their four children – and worked as a Real Estate Agent for William Pitt Real Estate.

Judy and Brian moved to London from 1978-1981 while Brian was working with Xerox Learning Systems. During this time Judy embraced the British culture-- taking classes, travelling and volunteering. She often remarked, “these were some of the best years of my life”.

Following the three years in London, Judy and Brian moved to Stamford, CT. In 1994 she and Brian were transferred to Singapore with Brian’s job, The

Times Mirror Company. Judy enjoyed volunteering and teaching English as a Second Language to adults and children in their community. Judy's sense of adventure peaked during this time and she enjoyed travelling, learning about Asian culture and meeting new people.
