Lindsey was born in Brookfield, Wisconsin in 1979 and graduated from Brookfield East High School in 1997. She earned an accounting degree in 2001 from the University of San Diego. After stints in public accounting and investment banking Lindsey found her true avocation as a Fashion Entrepreneur, opening Scout and Molly's Boutique 4 ½ years ago. Lindsey was quick-witted, loved music and fashion and had a killer ground stroke when she picked up a tennis racquet. Jimmy Buffet concerts with her mom and sister were always preferred outings. Her chill dog, Piper was her constant companion and new puppy, Dash provided lots of excitement around

the house.
