Lois Evelyn Krill (Hays) age 93 and Sarasota resident died peacefully April 29, 2017 in the presence of immediate family. Born October 31, 1923 she moved to Sarasota from Key West in 1988 with Dr. Galen E. Krill, her husband of 42 years. Following his death, she met and married Rev. Robert Hays of Trinity United Methodist Church.

Born in Mt. Vernon, Ohio, the youngest of five sisters, Lois Evelyn Roberts graduated high school, earned a BS in Business from Ohio State University, and completed an MS in Business Ed at Indiana State University.

In addition to 25 years of teaching high school business subjects in Benton Co., Indiana she was instrumental in publishing the school newspaper and yearbook at Boswell School. A member of Indiana State Teachers Association and American Association of University Women, her interest in furthering educational opportunities also included teaching Sunday school, Methodist Youth Fellowship, and Christian women's groups.
