Upon retirement she applied and was accepted in the US Peace Corps. She was a teacher Trainer assigned to the Fiji Island Suva for the Fiji College of Advanced Education.

After completing her Peace Corp position, she enjoyed traveling the world, and was always up and ready for any adventure. To the very end she was

completely aware and opinionated of current affairs, she enjoyed ending her day by reading a good book with a glass of red wine, and piece of chocolate.

She is survived by her daughter Marilyn (Brookes) Williams (Michael Paul) Houston, Texas, son David S. Brookes (Victoria Frances) of Cardiff by the Sea, California, daughter Melissa Brookes of Venice, Florida. Timothy Knetz of Venice, Florida. She is survived by 5 grandchildren and 7 great children.
