



## Mary Ellen Langley Lynch

February 26, 1924 - August 15, 2018

Mary Ellen Langley Lynch, of Venice, Florida, died on August 15, 2018, at the age of 94. Born on February 26, 1924 in Paterson, New Jersey to William and Alice Langley, Mary grew up in Fair Lawn where the family was active in St. Anne's R.C. Church. She attended College of St. Elizabeth and earned a B.A. in Business Administration in 1945. Mary worked in New York City for a year before marrying John Paul Lynch in 1946. Mary and John Paul resided in Fair Lawn until 1961 when they moved their growing family to Ramsey and joined St. Paul's R.C. Church. Mary helped create the first student library at St. Paul's School while studying in the Library Science program at Caldwell College.

In 1983, Mary and John Paul retired to Bird Bay Village in Venice, Florida. Mary found joy in volunteering for several worthy organizations including the Bird Bay Library and Epiphany Cathedral Library. Mary was also a proud founding member of the Venice chapter of Voice of the Faithful. Last year, Mary moved into Aston Gardens at Pelican Pointe; there she quickly made many dear friends.
