Norman Siegel, a 50 year resident of Sarasota, born on March 1, 1927, passed away in his home, Friday, June 10, 2016, surrounded by his loving family.

Mr. Siegel was born and raised in the Bronx, NY. At the age of 17, he enlisted and served in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He was one of the first Americans to land on Japanese soil. After an honorable discharge, he returned to New York, where he met his loving wife of 63 years, Lila. While working full-time and raising a family, he was educated at N.Y.U. and Pratt Institute, becoming a mechanical engineer. He moved with his family to Sarasota in 1966 and was the director of manufacturing at what is now L-3 Communications, formerly EMR. He continued his successful business career by founding Corrugated Packaging, Inc. Mr. Siegel derived great pleasure from creating stone sculptures, traveling the world with his wife and family and hiking the Colorado Mountains.

He is survived by his wife, Lila; his three children, Mark Siegel, Andrea Kocian (Patrik) and Sandra Coyle; and four grandchildren, Jolene Peterson (Chad), Hannah Greenbaum, Sean Coyle and Charlotte Greenbaum.

Thursday.
