



Rev. James W. Beeman

July 12, 1926 - October 1, 2016

James W. Beeman (Fr. Jim), a retired Catholic priest from the Diocese of Harrisburg, PA., died of Parkinson's disease on October 1, 2016 at Sorrento Assisted Living Center in Nokomis, FL, under the joint care with Tidewell Hospice.

Fr. Jim was born in Rochester (Irondequoit), N.Y., the second of six children, to Walter S. and S. Marie Beeman.

He graduated from Mount Saint Mary's in Maryland and was ordained in 1953 as a parish priest for the Diocese of Harrisburg where he served in several Pennsylvania churches, including as pastor of Our Lady of the Visitation in Shippensburg and as pastor of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament in Harrisburg. Before his retirement Fr. Jim served as prison chaplain in Lewisburg as well as chaplain at the state mental hospital.

He is survived by brothers Walter (Janet) Beeman of Nokomis, William (Mary Jane) of Nokomis, and Lawrence (Sharon) Beeman of Arlington, VA., as well as many niece's and nephew's. He leaves behind many lifelong friends who became part of his extended family, especially the Clark family in Harrisburg who took loving care of him as his health declined.

Fr. Jim was preceded in death by his parents and by his two sisters and their

spouses, Wilna and Robert Kyle, and Margaret and Gerard Metzger.

Fr. Jim directed that his body be donated to medical science.

A celebration of his life will be scheduled at a later date.
