Sanford K. Figdor (Sandy) was born March 3, 1926 in New York and grew up in the Bronx.

He completed one year at NYU before he was inducted into the service. He served on the aircraft carrier USS Shangri-La as a member of Admiral John McCain's personal staff in the Pacific Theater of WWII.

When the ended, Admiral McCain returned to the U.S. and he was reassigned to the USS Wake Island, and later to a patrol craft, PC 582. Upon discharge from the service he resumed his education with a BA from NYU, a MS and PhD from the University of New Brunswick (Canada) and a post-doctoral session at Wayne University, Detroit. He had a productive 38year career with Pfizer and contributed to many successful products.

In 1948 he married Constance Dreyman. This union delivered two wonderful children, Paula Lydia and George Andrew, but unfortunately ended 28 years later. Several years later he married Susanna Gorman for a wonderful 34year sojourn. He leaves his wife, 5children and 9 grandchildren.
