Seymour Hamer, 98, of Bradenton, FL died after a short illness on August 23, 2025. He was the youngest of his family, born in Brooklyn, NY to Isidore and Fannie Hamer. He lived for many years in Jericho, Long Island before moving to Hemlock Farms, PA in the Poconos Mts and Bradenton FL.

Seymour attended NYU College of Engineering in The Bronx, NY. In August 1945 he was drafted into the Army Air Corps and sent to Camp Pinedale, in Fresno California. A highlight of his time there was spending an afternoon with the famous tenor Jan Peerce. He worked for many years as the General Manager of an electronics company, Telemet, in Amityville NY.

Seymour loved music, gaining the ability to play saxophone, clarinet, flute, piano and organ. As a young man, he even played professionally as a member of a small three-piece band. Seymour was an avid golfer and later in life a dedicated mall walker.

In addition to his parents, Seymour was preceded in death by his brother Stanley and sister Leah Grode. Remaining to cherish his name is Zita, his beloved wife of almost 74 years, and his sons Alan Hamer (Kerry Hogan-Hamer) and Matthew Hamer (Gaylien Chun). He is also survived by his grandchildren Rebecca Hamer (John Villalon) and Elliot Hamer (Corrine Hamer). Seymour adored his three great-grandchildren and will be sadly
