



Wade Hampton Bynum Matthews

August 29, 2023

Wade Hampton Bynum Matthews of Sarasota, Florida passed away on August 29, 2023 at age 90. He was born in Winston-Salem, North Carolina to Marshall Lawrence Matthews and Mary Preston Bynum Matthews. He was the eldest of three boys, who lived apart for several years upon the illness and death of their mother when he was ten years old.

He was predeceased by his parents; his step-mother Ruth Benbow Matthews; his two step-brothers and their wives, who were all from Winston-Salem, North Carolina; his two sisters-in-law; and a nephew. His youngest brother, David Matthews of Alexandria, Virginia, died two days before him.

He is survived by his loving wife of 62 years, Betty Morgan Matthews, who he married in Munich, Germany; daughter Deborah Matthews of Miami, Florida; daughter Pamela (David) Klinger of Madison, Alabama; son Wade Matthews, Jr. of Austin, Texas; grandchildren Richard and Sarah Klinger; brother Lawrence Matthews of Walnut Cove, North Carolina; sister-in-law Amanda Carter of Alexandria, Virginia; and niece Mary (Don) Prouse of Decatur, Texas.

After 33 years, Mr. Matthews retired in 1990 as a career Foreign Service Officer with the rank of Minister Counselor in the U.S. Department of State. During his career, he lived with his family and worked in diplomatic and consular posts in eight foreign countries. He held acting ambassadorial positions in Chile and Guyana and was Consul General in Ecuador. In Washington, D.C., assignments included Deputy Director of the U.S. Mission to the Organization of American States and Director of the State Department's Office of Central American Affairs.

In 1995, Mr. Matthews helped supervise elections in Bosnia for the Organization of Security and Cooperation in Europe. He traveled extensively for the Department of State in the former Soviet Union in 1992 assisting the establishment of U.S. embassies. He evaluated and recommended changes for professional recruitment in international organizations in Western Europe and America. Mr. Matthews taught a graduate-level

course on U.S. post-cold war foreign policy. He loved to frequently speak to Florida organizations about the natural environment, population, international affairs, and civil liberties.

The world intrigued him even before he began reading newspapers daily at age seven until he died. Passionate about animals at an early age, he graduated with a degree in Zoology from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. After serving two years in the U.S. Army, he finished a year of law school at the University of Florida. In 1969, he completed a graduate study in Latin American Affairs at Stanford University. Mr. Matthews was a Professor of Strategy and Policy for two years at the U.S. Naval War College in Newport, Rhode Island. He spoke English, Spanish, and German and retained some once-fluent Portuguese.

After retiring to Sarasota, Florida, he became an advocate and community activist in international affairs and continued his life-long dedication to environmental protection and civil liberties. He served as President of the Sarasota-Manatee Chapter of Americans United for the Separation of Church and State, the Conservation Chair of Sarasota Audubon Society for over 20 years, Chairman of the Government Oversight Committee of the Better Government Association of Sarasota County, President of the United Nations Association Sarasota-Manatee Chapter, and on the Boards of Directors of Floridians for a Sustainable Population, the Environmental Confederation of Southwest Florida, the Foreign Service Retirees Association of Florida, and other non-profit organizations. Mr. Matthews worked actively for the Democratic Club of Sarasota County and was also appointed to the Environmental Commission to select land for Sarasota County to purchase for preservation. He was an original member of the Wisemen, who met monthly for years debating and seeking solutions on global and international issues.

Mr. Matthews, a lifetime avid birder and observer of nature, loved exploring new places with his family. Always fascinated by cultures, history, and current events, he traveled to 170 countries visiting habitats worldwide and introducing his family to diverse creatures both in the wild and domestic. He had many beloved pets during his lifetime from dogs, macaws, and monkeys to snakes and more. His love of life and family will be greatly missed by all who knew and loved him.

These photos were taken on 7/1 at the party for Wade's 90th birthday. He fought and lost his battle against cancer. There will be a Celebration of Life at the UU Church on Fruitville on Wednesday 9/6 at 2:00pm. He will be buried in VA soon thereafter. See the link below for more details and a full obituary.

Wade was President of the local chapter of Americans United for Separation of Church and State (AU) while I was Treasurer. We sat on the Board for more than a decade and worked very closely together. He became a surrogate father of sorts to me, providing counsel and comfort since the late 1990's. Wade will always have a place in my heart and will be sorely missed.

Our fellow board members either predeceased Wade or I've lost touch with them. Rev. Barry Lynn was the National Director of AU during our years with the local chapter and spoke frequently at our local events, as did Rob Boston, who still holds a position with AU in DC. (Barry & Rob - this is Karen Bastis - Linda is my FB pseudonym).

While I don't use social media anymore, I'm posting this in hope other locals who may have known Wade will share it and be aware of Wednesday's event. He was phenomenally active in local politics, environmental organizations, and so many other causes during the 25 years I knew him. He was the consummate volunteer who successfully left his mark on this world. I honor the memory of this remarkable man.
