



## William Pomeroy Hutchison

William Pomeroy Hutchison was born to Evelyn Wadhams and Robley Hutchison in Minneapolis, Minnesota. He grew up along with his brother, Hal Hutchison, along the shores of Lake Minnetonka and Sarasota Bay.

He is survived by Janice Huss Hutchison, his wife of nearly fifty years. Also, he had a beloved daughter, Leigh Hughes, and her husband, Jason Hughes, who he referred to as his son. His greatest joy in his life were his two grandchildren, Reagan and William Hughes, also of Sarasota. They lovingly referred to him as Poppy.

He is survived by his brother, Hal E. Hutchison, and his wife, Jane, of Woodbury, Connecticut. Will Hutchison, his namesake, Justin Berry (fiancée Kimberly Kuck), and James Berry (wife Jennifer and daughter Violette) are his beloved nephews.

Also surviving are sister-in-law, Kimberly McCarter, brother-in-law, Arthur McCarter, and nephew, Mitchell McCarter (wife Lennia and sons, Marcus and Matias).

After moving to Sarasota in 1957 Hutch attended Sarasota Junior High and

graduated from Sarasota High School in 1963. After graduation, he enlisted in the United States Air Force. He studied Russian language while attending language school at Indiana University. He served in Germany and Pakistan in the Intelligence Services. Upon his discharge, he graduated with honors in business administration/marketing research from Western Carolina University in 1971.

While attending Western Carolina, he met the love of his life, Janice Huss. They moved to Sarasota and married in 1973. Upon his return to Florida, he began his career in title searching and management at Lawyers Title Insurance Group. He was president of the Pomeroy Group until his retirement.

He served on both the City and Sarasota County Parks and Recreation Boards. He was responsible for preserving the original brick street in our neighborhood and the residential zoning parts of Arlington Street.

He was a man with many interests and friendships. He was a collector of vintage automobiles and boats, signs, toys, books, postcards, and other memorabilia.

He and his family cherished their twenty-five years of memories on Lake Lure and in Blowing Rock, North Carolina.
